Reception Parent Booklet

This leaflet provides information for parents on the end of year expectations for children in our school.

All the objectives will be the focus of direct teaching; any extra support you can provide in helping your children to achieve these is greatly appreciated.

If you have any queries regarding the content of this leaflet, or want support in knowing how best to help your child, please talk to your child's teacher.

Reading

- Link sounds to letters, naming and sounding the letters of the alphabet
- Use phonic knowledge to decode regular words.
- Read some common irregular words
- Read and understand simple sentences
- Join in with repeated phrases and anticipate key events and sayings in rhymes and stories



Writing

- Begin to say out loud what they are going to write, composing a sentence orally before writing it
- Write simple sentences that make sense e.g. *I went to the park. The castle is haunted.*
- Have an awareness of capital letters and full stops showing some evidence in their writing
- Use phonic knowledge to write words in ways which match spoken sounds
- Spell the first 45 high frequency words correctly

Mathematics

- Find the number of items in two groups by counting all of them
- Use the language of 'more' and 'fewer' to compare two sets of objects
- Say the number that is one more than a given number
- Find one more or one less from a group of 10 objects
- Discuss size, weight, capacity, distance, time and money to compare quantities and objects
- Recognise, create and describe patterns

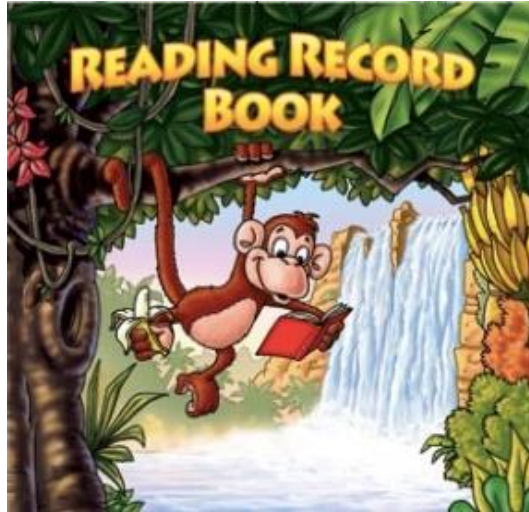


Feelings and behaviour

- Talk about their own and other children's behaviour
- Work as part of a group or class understanding and following the rules
- Adjust behaviour to different situations and take changes of routines in their stride
- Confidently try new activities and explain their preferences
- Speak confidently in a familiar group and ask for help when necessary
- Talk about themselves in a positive manner



Homework



Each child is given a reading book to read at home each week. You can support your child by reading the book out-loud to them and discussing the book together.



Each fortnight children are given a project to complete on a specific theme. There is guidance given on how you can support your child with completing this.
