pupils produce short videos of themselves making a healthy meal.



Ark Franklin Curriculum Map Spring Term - Year 1

Spanish *The Hungry Caterpillar:*
pupils learn to retell this story while exploring the lifecycle of a butterfly.



Numeracy

Addition and subtraction (up to 50): pupils learn to calculate mentally as well as using written methods and pictures to solve problems.

Time: pupils learn to read and write the time to o'clock and half past. They learn and sequence months of the year and place daily activities in order.

Fractions: pupils learn to recognise and find half and quarter of objects, shapes and amounts. They use their knowledge of half and quarter to give directions using turns.

Measures: length and weight: pupils learn to measure, record and describe lengths, heights and weights, making direct comparisons.



R.E. Judaism and Buddhism: pupils explore sacred stories explaining the origins of religions, developing an appreciation for different beliefs and values.



Music Pupils recognise the differences between *pulse and rhythm*, learning to perform with a sense of pulse. *Pitch:* pupils learn to discriminate between higher and lower sounds when creating simple melodic patterns.



Geography *Key Geography skills:* pupils will learn to name and locate the four countries of the UK including capital cities. They will use the 4 compass points to navigate Queens Park on their own hunt. *Seasons and weather:* pupils will explore the weather across the UK linking their geographical knowledge to their learning in science.



Art *Story boxes:* pupils create story boxes to represent well-known traditional tales.

Science *Everyday materials:* pupils learn to recognise a variety of materials and describe their physical properties, distinguishing between the object and the materials it is made from. *Seasons and changes:* pupils identify the four seasons and different weather types across the world.



Literacy:

The Three Little Pigs: pupils learn to write and punctuate full sentences with accuracy, identifying and using nouns and verbs in their writing.

Instructions: pupils learn to write a set of instructions to teach others how to complete a task, using conjunctions to sequence events.

Recounts: pupils learn to write about an event placing each step in the correct order and sequencing their writing.

We're Going on a Bear Hunt: pupils learn to use a range of openers to start stories and sentences, while enhancing sentences with adjectives.



P.E. [Friday] *Dance and gymnastics:* students develop a broad range of techniques and skills towards choreographing a performance piece.



Outdoor Learning *Spring survival:* pupils learn the skills to tie knots, perform wilderness first aid, cook in the wild, and sow seeds for Spring, as well as learning to navigate landscapes.
