

## Numeracy



### Solving measure and money problems:

Pupils will solve money problems and convert between different units of measure including hours to minutes.

Shape and symmetry: Pupils will identify lines of symmetry in different orientations and complete symmetric figures.

Position and direction: Pupils will learn to describe positions on a 2D grid as coordinates and describe movements between positions as translations. They will also plot points and draw sides to complete a designated shape.

## Art



Greek Vases: Pupils will investigate Ancient Greek cases and examine their use of pattern and design in their work. Using elements of pattern and story-telling, pupils will design and construct a Greek vase using papier mache techniques before adding design elements to it.
