

Numeracy



Application and reasoning: Pupils will review the knowledge taught over the year in mathematics and begin to apply it to new situations. They will combine concepts to tackle longer more complex questions and be challenged to reason and explain and justify their thinking.

They will tackle longer, more complex puzzles and investigations that will require them to work systematically and in groups to discover sequences, themes and outliers from their data. They will collect data using surveys and present their findings to the rest of the class.

Art



Textile prints: Pupils will investigate the role of line, shape and repetition in pattern. They will then use foam printing to create an Aztec-inspired design on a piece of calico which will then be combined with their peer's work to create a large display of patterns.

ICT

We are game developers: Pupils will plan their own simple computer game. They will design characters and backgrounds and create a working prototype which can be tested.

Properties and changes of materials:

Pupils will learn how to recover a substance from a solution and the difference between chemical and physical changes.

Living things and their habitats: Pupils will examine insects, migration and pollination.

Newspaper articles: Pupils will revisit this genre aiming to add complexity to the information that they present to the audience and detail the emotions of eye witnesses using both direct and reported speech.

Suspense stories: Pupils will aim to send a shiver down the spine of their readers as they create suspense filled fiction that keeps you on the edge of your seat until the very last paragraph!

Discussion Text: Pupils will learn to remain impartial in a debate presenting both sides of an argument and developing their ideas to inform a reader before summarising and reflecting on their own options around the discussion.

Poetry: Pupils will learn and perform poetry as a group considering how best to engage the audience.
