

Numeracy



Multicultural multiplication: Pupils will examine multiplication strategies from different ancient cultures, learning the processes and explaining how they calculate the correct answer. They will also evaluate their efficiency and compare them to other methods they have learnt.

Surveys and investigations: Pupils will generate questions that they wish to discover from the school and create effective surveys that they will get other pupils in the school to complete before presenting their information in tables and charts and discussing common themes.

Art



Canopic jars: From their understanding of Canopic jars from learning about Ancient Egyptians, pupils will create their own Egyptian style Canopic jar using a water bottle and papier mache before sculpting their own lid based on their selected Egyptian god.

ICT

Coding application: Pupils will learn develop their understanding of computerised code giving instructions building in complexity. They will also work together to find bugs in the code.

Islam: Pupils will explore sacred stories explaining the origins of religions, developing an appreciation for different beliefs and values.

Ancient Egyptians: Pupils will examine the role of the Gods in Ancient Egyptian culture thinking about the pyramids, the process of their construction and reasoning behind mummification. They will also look at hieroglyphics, framing and the importance of the Nile in the development of their epic civilisation.

Light: Pupils will examine lenses, how light changes moving in water and properties of the electromagnetic spectrum.

Weathering and erosion: Pupils will look at water erosion and the formation of soil and its three layers.

Playscripts: Pupils will work collaboratively to storyboard and script a playscript around a given theme. These will include complex stage directions. These will then be developed into films which the children will act in, film and edit. Finally, as part of this film festival, they will create posters and trailers to encourage others to see the movies before showing them in a film screening at the end of the year.

Poetry: Pupils will learn and perform poetry as a group considering how best to engage the audience.
