IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING “SAFER STREETS”

Please see a letter from Brent Council regarding the Safer Streets initiative. A camera will now be in place and we will ensure that the “visible deterrent” barriers or cones in the road are there but we will no longer be staffing the entrances to Kempe Road. My advice is what it has always been: please ensure that you and your whole family take great care on the road. The Safer Streets initiative will reduce the traffic and reduce the risk of accidents but does not remove traffic altogether – many are eligible to travel on the road. Please contact Brent for further information on exemptions.

Dear Parents

Please be advised that the CCTV camera enforcement for our school street will commence on Monday 7th November 2022. All restrictions will apply as per the signs and unauthorised vehicles entering the zone during these times will be issued with a Penalty Charge Notice (PCN).

The objective of the School Street is to make the school run safer, healthier and more enjoyable for the whole community, as well as for children travelling to school; not to penalise parents. For those who need to rely on the car for children to travel to school, they can park slightly further away and walk the last part of the journey,

Pupils, parents and carers with limited mobility or holding a blue badge should discuss this with us, we can then arrange for an exemption from the restrictions. Please note you should still avoid parking on school keep clear markings and be mindful of pedestrians and cyclists within the zone.

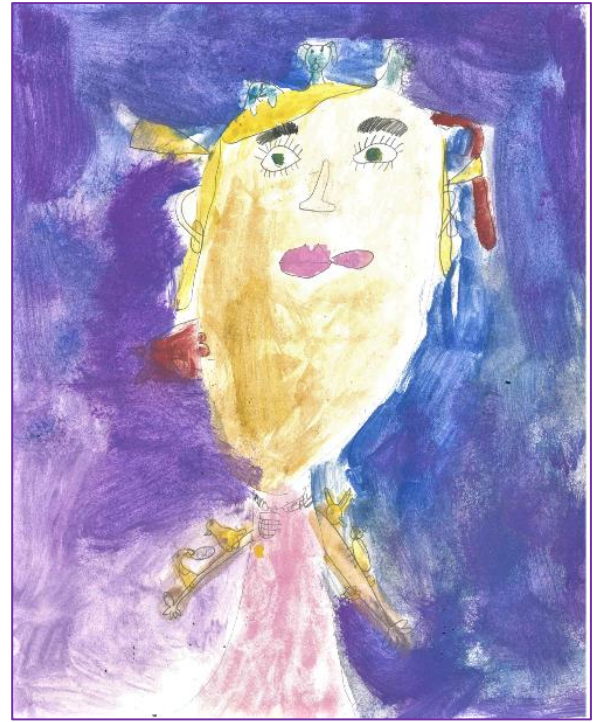
