Mathematics



London is famous for red double decker buses.

Can you draw or paint a picture of a red double decker **London** bus?

When you have drawn your bus, please draw 3 people upstairs and 3 people downstairs.

How many people did you draw altogether?

See if you can find your number cards again and place these in order to make a number line.

You will be much quicker at doing this now. Ask an adult to time you and see how many seconds it takes you to put your numbers in the correct order.

Now muddle the cards up again and see if you can order them one more time, but try to do it even quicker this time!
