Literacy



You have worked very hard at your letter formation over the last few weeks, and you have now finished another letter pattern string.

r n h m b p

Use your finger to write one of these letters on an adult's back and ask them to tell you which letter you wrote. Try this with all the letters you have practised this term, and then swap over and ask the adult to write a letter on your back and you try to guess which letter they wrote.

Keep practising your letter formation and don't forget the letters we practised at the beginning of the month.

Mathematics



Today you can have a fun Friday number activity by making your own set of indoor skittles and by playing with these.

Make a set of skittles from empty toilet or kitchen roll tubes, empty bottles or tin cans.

You can decorate your skittles if you wish, or you can leave them just as they are.

Stand your skittles up and arrange these in a pattern, and then stand some distance away.

Gently throw a soft ball or some scrunched up paper and try to knock your skittles over.

Each time you have a turn, write down how many skittles you manage to knock down.

If you don't want to write the numeral, then find the correct number card and hold that up.

Count how many turns it takes for you to knock all your skittles down.

If you wish, you can write a number on each skittle, and every time you knock a skittle down, you can give yourself the same number of points as the number on your skittle. Use raisins or other small objects to help you to count out your points accurately. You can add more points each time you knock down a skittle, and at the end of the game you can work out how many points you got altogether.

Other Activities



At the beginning of the month, I asked you to learn your address and I asked an adult to point out your **address** on any mail that came through your letterbox. I hope you all received a letter through your letterbox this week, and that you all still remember your address.

Yesterday you had fun learning a penguin song and dance. Today you are going to learn another fun penguin dance. After a house building warm up on the video, you can watch and learn some different penguin moves and then put them altogether and join in with the big video **penguin bop**.
