Mathematics



Watch and sing along with this number song about 10 little fish swimming in the sea https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=dg0cQtVisLw

Each time another fish comes along there is one more fish in the group.

Ask an adult to sing that song with you. The adult should sing the first bit and you can then say how many fish there were. Be warned though, the adult will sing the verses in the wrong order, so you will have to think carefully how many fish there were when one more came along.

The adult will sing a verse, for example:

Adult: "Three little fishes swimming in the sea,
Along came another one..."

You can then sing the last line that tells us how many fish there were.

You: "Then there were..."

You will have to listen carefully to the number the adult says, so that you can say how many there were when one more came along.
