**Respect**


. Watch this short video with an adult and then talk about it together.

What to do:

- \*Cut long strips of paper
- \*Draw different lines on them as shown in the picture.
- \*Stick them to the edge of the table
- \*Give your child some scissors and invite them to hold one end of the paper and cut along the lines.

Why don't you make a garland by drawing lines on a piece of paper and then cutting carefully along the lines to make strips. You could then colour the strips and link them to make a garland or decoration.
