

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Mathematics



Today in maths you are going to solve equations by making ten.

When we solve equations, it is sometimes easier to make it into a new equation to help us find the answer. We can do this by making it 10 and changing the equation to give us the same answer. For example to solve $9 + 4$ we can change it to $10 + 3$.

For this you will need something to represent the number (lego, pasta, cubes etc.)

Challenge – What other equations can you solve by making 10? Pick a number between 6 and 9 and then roll a dice and see which number you are going to add to it.

Miss Banfield choose the number 7 and then she rolled a dice and got 5.

So her equation was $7 + 5$ which she made into ten and it changed to $10 + 2$ (if you don't have a dice pick a number at random between 1 & 6).
