Writing

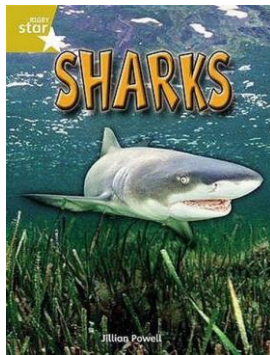


Today, you are going to be learning to use **similes** and then using them in your writing. It's time to write the ending section of your Cinderella story. Watch the video [here](#).
