Today, you will be writing an introductory statement which will tell the reader what the instructions are about.

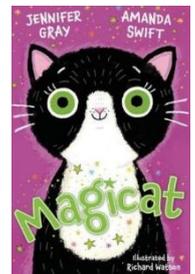
