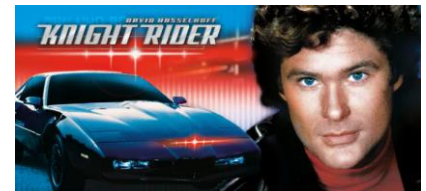

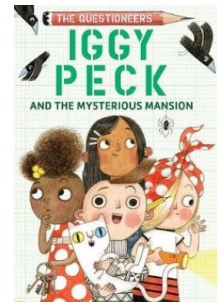
In this clip, you will see the trailer for a TV show about a high-tech spy car called KITT.

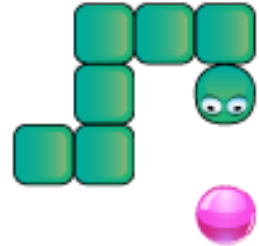
