Mathematics

Solving measure and money problems:

Pupils will learn to convert between units of measure; estimate, compare and solve simple measure and money problems including fractions and decimals.

<u>Shape and symmetry:</u> Pupils will compare and classify shapes and angles and identify lines of symmetry in 2-D shapes.

<u>Position and direction:</u> Pupils will learn to describe positions and movements and plot specified points and lines on a 2-D grid.

Pupils will learn to read Roman numerals and understand a brief history of the number system; recognise and use square numbers and their notation; and understand negative numbers to -100.

Science

<u>Living Things and their Habitats:</u> Pupils will consider how living things are grouped and begin to use classification keys. They will also investigate pollution around school considering why air quality may differ by location.

Literacy
