Wishing everyone a wonderful Wednesday!

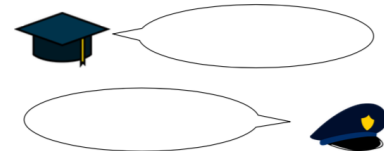

Today in music you are going to be listening to a piece of music composed by the George Gershwin. Here you will find the [link to one of his pieces](#) as well as a little bit about him.

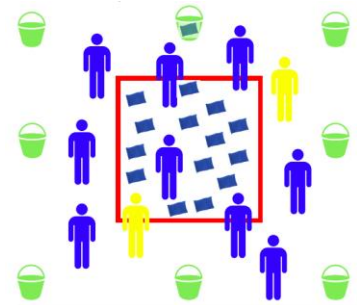
