Dear Parents

Unbelievably we have already come to the end of our first half term of the 2015/16 academic year, busy though it has been, next half term will be even busier, so brace yourselves.

Yesterday we held our first Happy Playgrounds tea party to celebrate great playground behaviour: well done to all those who attended.

For the last few weeks we have trialled year 1 being collected from the dining room. After monitoring the situation, we have decided to return to the collection of all year 1 and 2 children from the KS1 playground after half term. The combination of adults collecting from nursery and from the dining room at the end of the day is compromising the safeguarding of all our children; I hope you will support us in keeping all our children safe.

Sadly I have to report that a moped rider was knocked off on Harvist Road this week by a car driven by one of our school community. Each week I write and ask drivers to stop double parking and executing three point turns in the roads adjacent to the school, and now someone has been injured. I understand that some of you must drive our pupils to school, but please be mindful of other users of the road and local residents; we've had many complaints.

As part of our Open Air Classroom project, on Friday 6<sup>th</sup> November we will be doing an online survey with our children on their knowledge and understanding of food, nutrition, gardening and health so that we can develop our garden and resources to suit their needs.
